Bullseye

Machine Paper-Piecing

Featured Teacher—Becky Goldsmith All Skill Levels

Learn the secrets of foundation paper-piecing and set-in circles! You will find that this 20" block is a whole lot easier to construct than you thought it would be.

Each ring is made up of foundation paper-pieced sections that are sewn together into complete rings. The rings are set together as they are completed.

Choose fabrics and colors for your own block to set the mood you want, either vintage OR modern

A \$5 kit with instructions to make this block and printed vellum pages for 1 block and 1 sheet of self-adhesive laminate) is required. Purchase the kit from instructor in class.

Each participant needs to bring fabric for 1 Block

If you are a fast sewer, bring fabric for 2 blocks to class. It's unlikely that you will get to a 2nd

block, but it could happen. I will have extra printed vellum on hand.

Cut and place your pieces in separate, labeled baggies.

Center

- 1 Cut 4 light medium pieces 2 1/4" x 3 1/4".
- 2 Cut 4 dark medium pieces 2 1/4" x 3 1/4".

Ring 1

- 1 Cut 16 light pieces 1 3/4" x 3".
- 2 Cut 16 dark pieces 2" x 3 3/4".
- 3 Cut 16 light-medium pieces 2 1/2" x 2 1/2".

Ring 2

- 1 Cut 32 light pieces 2 1/2" x 3 1/2".
- 2 Cut 32 medium-dark pieces 2" x 3 1/4".
- 3 Cut 32 medium-dark pieces 2" x 2 3/4".
- 4 Cut 32 light pieces 1 3/4" x 3".

Block Corners

1—Cut 2 rectangles 10 1/2" x 13".

Pick - Up Sticks

Machine Piecing

Becky Goldsmith, Featured Teacher All skill levels

This class combines improvisational cutting with speedy piecing techniques. All sewing is done on the machine.

The pattern (from *The Quilter's Practical Guide To Color*) is provided in class.


Materials to make the quilt

 $WOF = width \ of fabric$

- Background fabric: 3 yards
 - Cut 36 squares 10" x 10".
- Strip fabrics (blues): A variety to total 3 yards
 - Cut 72 strips 1 1/2" x 40" from a variety of fabrics.
- Binding: 7/8 yard
 - Cut 1 square 26" x 26" to make a 2 1/2"-wide continuous bias strip 220" long for the quilt.
- Backing and sleeve: 3 3/8 yards
- Batting: 56" x 56"

Bring To Class

- ♦ Recommended book: *The Quilter's Practical Guide to Color*
- ♦ Background fabric:
 - ♦ Bring at least 16 squares cut 10" x 10"
- ♦ Strips (blues):
 - Bring 24-36 strips 1 1/2" x 40" cut from a variety of fabrics. Please note that the block construction is improvisational so the amount needed with vary.
- ♦ Rotary cutter and mat
- ♦ 6" x 12" ruler Optional, but handy: 10" x 10" ruler.
- A sewing machine in good repair that you know how to use! Piecing thread Small scissors Pins for piecing Seam ripper (just in case)
- An extension cord and surge protector with multiple outlets. A portable iron and mat. Note that in some venues you may not be able to use it.
- Optional: A portable design wall Optional: You know what you like to have in class. It might be a chair, a cushion for the chair provided, or a light... whatever it may be, bring it with you. Email questions to Becky at becky.pieceocake@gmail.com.





Backyard Birds

Hand Applique

Featured Teacher - Becky Goldsmith All Skill Levels

Who can resist a perky bird! This needleturn hand applique class focuses on the invisible applique stitch, outer points, inner and outer curves, small shapes and off-the-block stitching.

The 12" x 12" block pattern (from the book, Backyard Bird) is provided in class.

Fabric

- I recommend that you pre-wash all fabric before class.
- Block background fabric: 1 square 14" x 14"
- Applique fabrics: A variety of large scraps in colors suitable for the block.

Additional Supplies

- Small paper scissors
- Small fabric scissors
- One 12" x 12" square of medium weight clear upholstery vinyl. If the vinyl comes with tissue paper, cut it with the vinyl. If you can't find upholstery vinyl, a clear heavy-weight shower curtain liner (Target or Walmart) can work but be aware that it may be a little stretchy and harder to handle.
- An ultra fine point Sharpie marker in black
- 2 sheets of clear, heavy weight, single-sided, self-adhesive laminate. The Fellowes or Scotch brands are good and you can find them at an office supply store or online at pieceocake.com.
- I will supply you with a needle and a toothpick.
- Applique pins. I recommend Bohin's 1/2" sequin pins, Karen K Buckley's Shorter Perfect Pins, and sometimes Cover's 3/4" pins.
- I will have Superior Masterpiece 100% cotton thread for you to sew with in class.
- General's charcoal pencil in white for medium-to-dark fabrics. I use a Blackwing 602 graphite pencil for light fabrics. I will have some available for purchase in class. Optional: Sewline or similar 9mm mechanical pencil in white and gray.
- A sandpaper board or a sheet of fine grain sandpaper.



Beginning Free Motion Quilting

Machine Quilting

Mary Beth Dunn, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner

You CAN free motion quilt! You have to start somewhere and this class is the place. Lots of encouragement and some stress free practice will get you going. We will start with making sure the thread tension is right and move on to meandering, paisley, meander with circles, squares, triangles, pebbles, McTavishing, swirls, waves, bamboo shoots, leaves, flames, flowers, stars, hearts, grids, asterisk, and other beginner quilt designs. We will also explore border and sashing quilting designs. You will leave realizing that you CAN do this!



Supply List:

Fabric: (4) 15 inch square quilt sandwiches made of muslin or light colored solid cotton fabric with batting

in the middle. It is fine to use fabric spray to sandwich them together (spray at home please).

Other Supplies: contrasting thread, free motion quilting foot (not a walking or dual feed foot), the extension table for your machine is really necessary, quilting gloves like Machingers, pencil and paper, may need to have a couple of different size needles, and basic sewing supplies.

Make sure your machine can do free motion quilting- the feed dogs must drop and you must have the free motion quilting foot that fits your machine (a clear footed one is nice for visibility.)

My Favorite Things, Tips, and Techniques

Demo

Sue Marshal, Teacher Skill Level – Beginner to Advanced



I will bring my favorite quilt room tools and demonstrate how they help make quilting more fun for me. I will demonstrate how I achieve a 1/4 inch seam for the fabric and thread type being used for that specific project. I will show you how I then can achieve that same seam on my take to class machine, my big stationary machine, and whatever machine I have set up in front of the TV. And how when I dig a UFO out, it only takes seconds to set up whatever machine I wish to use to be a perfect match for that old project. I developed a technique for matching long lines of seams (think Bargello) with only 1 pin and I can't wait to share with you how easy and fast it is. I also have a super technique to keep bias edges from stretching (piecing triangles) as they go through the sewing machine. This method also makes my time sitting at the sewing machine much easier as I am not matching edges and trying to keep them exact until they get under the needle. And while they are under the presser foot - they don't move at all. And so much more!

Optional supply list:

- Paper on a clipboard and pen for notes.
- Camera, with video, to take pictures of demonstrations and things (phone cameras would be perfect).
- Comfy Shoes are a must in order to see everything we will be moving about the room and hovering over the demonstrations.

Sunset Landscape Collage

Fused Collage & Machine Quilting

Larry McKenney, Teacher Skill Level: Beginner to Advanced

Whether you have made art quilts in the past or not, this class will give you the inspiration to jump in with both feet. Step by step instructions will be given to help guide you to create a stunning sunset landscape art quilt. No matter your skill level, you will be able to come away with a wall quilt that you will be proud to share with others.

Participants in this class will create a Sunset Landscape Collage based on a photo provided by the instructor. You will have the freedom to change and add or delete things to make your design uniquely your own. After a brief introduction to landscape quilting, we will begin by adding fusing to the back of fabrics and layering them to create the background sky and middle ground. Next we will baste the top, batting and backing together and quilt the three layers using appropriate threads.

You will need a free motion foot such as an open or closed toed embroidery foot. Trees, leaves, grasses, etc, will be added to the foreground using a variety of materials including textured fabrics and yarns. The foreground will be covered with tulle to make it easier to quilt. Fabric paints and fabric markers will be used to add detail and to give the landscape depth and dimension. Using free motion quilting the piece will be completed.

Materials List:

- 1 piece of foam-core board (20x30 a standard size) covered with batting. Wrap the batting around the board and tape to to the back using making tape. This will be your work station and make it easy to carry back and forth to the ironing station.
- Small rotary cutter: I suggest an 18mm or 28mm;
- Scissors: I suggest a small pair and a large pair. The small one is good for cutting small areas.
- 1 box of parchment paper. (we use this so that the fusing does not clog up the iron)
- Black Sharpie Marker (fine point and extra fine point work very well)
- Sewing Machine with embroidery foot or free motion foot.

Machine Applique

Mary Bauer, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner and Up



27" x 44" - Color view at KHQS.org!

Applique a village scene with houses surrounding the town skating rink. Each house is a small pocket and the roof will lift up to fill the pocket with goodies for use as an advent calendar. Using fusible for the smaller pieces (trees, doors, windows, Santa, etc.) this project will complete in no time. Your precious little ones can count down to Christmas with a new surprise every day.

Supplies:

Fusible web*- ~1 yd., Fabric marker (both chalk and water soluble), Freezer paper for skating rink, Black Permanent Fabric pen (Micron), White paint marker for numbers on doors (or) embroider, Batting for 30" x 48"

Sewing Machine and basic sewing supplies for machine.

Fabric:

Crazy Stars Scrappy Strip Piecing

Machine Piecing

Karen Riggins, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner to Advanced

This a fun and easy method of creating a scrap quilt using base squares/rectangles and scrap strips of fabric. Creating the design is the really fun part of this project, because the machine work is easy. Students will have a choice of working with a square base or a rectangle base. Each style creates a totally different look. The borders can be solid or pieced.

The background squares/rectangles can be dark or light. The scrap strips need to be in high contrast to the background. Some ideas include: White squares with strips in Christmas colors, Bright orange with dark harvest colors for Fall, Dark green with floral prints would work for Spring, various black fabrics with bright color strips. The variations are endless, as are the embellishment opportunities, as in, couching, beads, quilting with metallic threads, etc.

This method would also work great for a jacket, vest, table runner and large purse, especially if ribbons were used instead of fabric strips.

35" x 42" or smaller

SUPPLY LIST:

- 11/2 yd of background fabric: 100% cotton Background fabric can be very light or very dark. It can also be a dark or light mono-print.
- Lots of strips of fabric: Strips need to vary in size from 3/4" wide to 1 1/2" wide. Length does not matter. The fabrics can be cotton, cotton backed lame', satin, silk or anything that has the weight of cotton and is backed with a lightweight interfacing so it is not real slippery.
- Neutral color thread
- Sewing machine and needles, etc., straight pins
- Rotary Blade knife, ruler, and mat, iron and ironing mat, pencil or pen

*We recommend bringing lights.




A PIECE O'CAKE LIFE

Wednesday evening lecture at 7:00 PM



After 20+ years, with more than 30 books under my belt, I have stories to share with you and who doesn't love a good story?! I wasn't sure where to start this particular story, so I asked quilters what they wanted to know about my quilting life. This lecture answers those questions.



Mary Bauer, Teacher

Skill Level—Advanced Beginner



For those KHQS members that missed "All Geared Up" or those individuals that would like to "do it again", this class has four options. After you register you will be contacted to choose which quilt you will make as your class project. All four patterns and instructions will be part of your class hand-out. In addition, your chosen project for the class will have all the paper-piecing sheets you will need to finish that particular option. Plus - one of the class samples will be given as a door prize!

Supplies:

Basic sewing supplies, sewing machine, open toe foot, Cutting mat, rotary cutter, ruler (12" x 6"), Neutral 50 wt. thread to blend with fabric choices, box of colored pencils, glue stick, Fabric: ¼ yard for each color gear, 1 ½ - 2 yards background depending on project chosen

All Geared Up – the original paper piecing pattern with six arms (hexagon) in each gear all going in one direction



Nanopus – three arms in each gear (diamond).



<u>In Reverse</u> – six arms in each gear (hexagon), going in forward and reverse.

Four speed – four arms in each gear (square), no Y-seams in this one.

Cardinal Mosaic

Fusible Applique Sewing Machine

Nancy Metzger, Teacher Any Skill Level

Make this cute 11' x 14' mosaic cardinal based on a Charley Harper design using fused batik squares. Fabric is placed on sticky stabilizer with fine tweezers using a background gridded pattern. Once all squares are placed, the fabric is fused, and then placed on background "grout" fabric. Quilting is done through a tulle overlay using ecru or monofilament thread. Beak and leg details are stitched with black thread. These little quilts are addicting and fun!

Machine Piecing

Judy Hobbs, Teacher Skill Level—Beginner and up

An easy 7" finished block to construct, "Linked" is a good scrap buster. Using a technique called partial seams, the block goes together quickly using 1 ½ " strips.

This quilt can be made scrappy, as I did, or in a 2 color combination plus a background color. My quilt is 7 by 9 blocks, but can be made as large or small as you wish.

Supplies:

Fabric: I used all different colors of fabrics cut into 1 ½" strips. Good time to use those scraps!

- We will use strips as small as 1 ½" by 1 ½". Have your 1 ½" strips cut, but don't bother cutting strips into lengths yet. We will do that in class.
- Background: I chose a cream background, but used a variety of cream fabrics—again, using up those scraps! You will need to precut 2 ½" strips for 2 ½" squares and 1 ½" strips to make 1 ½" squares. (For one block you will need 4-- 2 ½" squares and 5-- 1 ½ " squares.)



- Thread: Neutral color–I like light or dark grey.
- Rotary cutter, mat, and small ruler
- Iron
- Basic sewing supplies and your machine in good working condition

Lynnette LeGette, Teacher Skill Level - Advanced Beginner to Intermediate


For all of those out there that love a good Churndash (Monkey Wrench) block, this is the quilt for you! We will make the basic blocks that go into this quilt, learn different ways to make flying geese, half-square triangles, and square-in-a-square pieces, and discuss how changes in color selection can alter the appearance of the pattern. This pattern works well in a variety of color-ways, including red and green if you want a Christmas quilt. Adjust the number of blocks in the quilt to make every size from a wall hanging to king size... whatever fits your needs and fabric stash! Participants will be given the pattern and cutting instructions for 2 block sizes.

Exuberance

Machine Piecing

Donna Duncan, Teacher All Skill Levels

If you can use a rotary cutter, make a four patch, and attach sashing, this project will be a snap for you. The design itself is composed of only two block designs, which you can master in the first hour of the workshop. After that, it's easy-peasy – just "coasting"! Use twenty fat quarters, or stash fabrics.

In this workshop, you'll get a good start on this easy-to-piece quilt for your den or bedroom, or for a gift. The design is adaptable in size, for those who wish to make it a bit larger or smaller.

Made in bold brights with black accents for a lively, sophisticated quilt; in florals with green or blue accents, for a garden-fresh quilt; in pastels with neutrals for a serene quilt; with a hodgepodge of scraps for a gutsy, energetic quilt; or in some other palette – however you design it, it's sure to be a triumph.

Some pre-cutting directions will be provided prior to the workshop for those who wish to get a jump-start on their class work.

Fabrics: Yardages are for a 73" x 74½"quilt.

Twenty fat quarters – These may be pastels, brights, florals, geometrics, or whatever suits your fancy. (If you want to use stash fabrics, you will need 80 rectangles cut exactly 7½" x 9½" – the more variety, the merrier!)

2½ yards accent fabric – You will want this to contrast with your fat quarters or scraps, for best effect. A solid color, or near-solid is recommended.


Backing and binding fabric – You will have enough of the $2\frac{1}{4}$ yards of accent fabric to make the binding. You will eventually need backing. Donna usually prewashes her fabrics. You may do as you wish.

Hints: The yardage listed above (fat quarters or scraps from your stash) is adequate for the 75" x 76" quilt. If you wish to bring extra, that is fine – just don't bring a closetful! You'll only frustrate yourself!

KENTUCKY HERITAGE QUILT SOCIETY

History

In 1981, a group of quilt lovers, quilt makers and quilt collectors joined together to form the Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society, the first statewide organization to be concerned with all aspects of quilting throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Since that small beginning, our individual membership has grown with members in almost every county and almost 50 affiliate guilds. Purpose

To promote understanding, appreciation and knowledge of the art and craft of quilt making.

To support and expand the collection and preservation of Kentucky quilts and the records of Kentucky quilt makers and their work.

To undertake such activities as shows, contests and educational workshops.

The Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society is an equal opportunity organization whose membership enrollment does not discriminate on the basis of gender, age, race, or religion.

Activities

Workshops are held at the annual KHQS Meeting & Getaway in June. Each fall, quilters gather with a nationally known teacher for the three-day KHQS Quilting Adventures.

KHQS, along with QAK and KHAS hold several retreats throughout the year.

Quilt Registry Days are held in counties across Kentucky. From these, information of use to the academic and museum world is collected and stored at the Kentucky Museum in Bowling Green.

KHQS has organized 13 districts across the state. District Leaders create the link between local, state, and national quilters. National Quilting Day, which had its beginnings in Kentucky, is celebrated on the third Saturday in March. KHQS Districts celebrate this special

day with Quilters' Day Out events in each district across the state.

In 1995, the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society (KHAS) was formed as an auxiliary group of KHQS. Its purpose is to promote the techniques,

appreciation and preservation of hand and machine appliqué. In 2004, the Quilt Artists of Kentucky (QAK) formed with the purpose to serve as a support and information group for innovative quilters who choose to practice creativity with quilts as an art form; to educate about the art of the quilt; and explore venues for art quilt exhibition. <u>Members of these groups must also be members of KHOS</u>.

KHQS actively works to keep the art and craft of quilt making alive by providing judges, teachers and demonstrations at shows and special events. KHQS offers financial assistance to affiliate guilds who hold quilt shows. Scholarships are offered for the annual Quilting Adventures. Each year members can participate in quilt block contests and a quilt challenge. The challenge quilts then become a traveling exhibit viewed by thousands of people over the course of a year.

Newsletter

The newsletter is published four times a year for the membership. The newsletter is full of information about the quilting world, up-coming shows and exhibits, free patterns and, of course, up-to-date information on all KHQS activities.

Dues

Individual KHQS membership dues are \$20.00 annually. Guilds and quilt clubs may also join as KHQS Affiliates for an annual fee of \$15.00. Dues for the Kentucky Heritage Appliqué Society and Quilt Artists of Kentucky are both \$5.00 annually. Contributions are always welcome. Individual members are given discounts to lectures workshops hosted by the Society.
